As school counselors, we are here to help with getting acclimated to the school environment and to support all students' needs as it relates to academic, social/emotional, and career development.

NOTES FROM THE HEALTH OFFICE



IMMUNIZATION AND STUDENT HEALTH FORMS

Please bring a paper copy of your student's most recent immunization record to registration in August, especially if they have received any new immunizations over this past school year. Just a few reminders... IMMUNIZATIONS: All 6th through 12th graders are required to have the Tdap booster, typically given at age 11. The "p" (pertussis) has been added to the standard Td booster to protect teens against whooping cough.



OPTIONS

If you cannot get in to see your doctor before school starts in August, you can also get required immunizations at Walgreens, King Soopers, and Costco, or the Health and Wellness Centers at Centennial High School and Lincoln Middle School <u>https://hwcenter.org</u>. VACCINES REQUIRED FOR K-12

- Hepatitis B.
- Diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis (DTap).*
- Inactivated poliovirus (IPV).*
- Measles, mumps, rubella (MMR).*
 - Varicella (chicken pox).*
 - Tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis (Tdap).**

*Students 4 through 6 years of age are required to have their final doses of DTaP, IPV, MMR and Varicella prior to kindergarten entry.

**Students are required to have Tdap prior to entry into 6th grade. One dose of Tdap is required for 6th through 12th grades.

EXEMPTIONS

If you choose not to vaccinate your student with any of the required immunizations, you must submit a new non-medical (formally known as religious/personal belief) exemption every school year after July 1st and bring a copy of the completed form or online certificate to Timnath Middle-High School during registration in August.

These are the two ways to submit a non-medical (religious/personal belief) exemption to any Colorado school: • Submit the certificate of nonmedical exemption WITH a signature from an immunizing provider who is a medical doctor, doctor of osteopathic medicine, advanced practice nurse or delegated physician's assistant OR Submit the certificate of non-medical exemption received upon the completion of CDPHE's Online Immunization Education Module. Parents of students in grades K-12 claiming a non-medical exemption must submit one annually. Non-medical exemptions expire June 30th each year. If you submit a certificate of nonmedical exemption on or before June 30th, it will not be valid for the upcoming school year.

IF YOU NEED MEDICATION AT SCHOOL

If you need forms for any health/medication reasons for the health office or to self-carry emergency medications during the upcoming school year, please visit the Poudre School District website. Review and print from section 6. Consent for taking medication at school; Authorization to Administer Medicine or Carry and Self-Administer Asthma/Allergy Medicine and section 8. Health care action plans for the corresponding health care action plan paperwork.

Self-carry is allowed and highly encouraged in middle school for emergency medications only such as asthma rescue Inhalers, EpiPens (or any Epinephrine injector), Benadryl (severe allergic reactions only), Glucagon, etc. Some families have their student self-carry (purse/backpack/locker/PE locker for after school activities, clubs, athletics, field trips, walking home, etc.) and then store a second medication in the health office if they prefer. Kinard staff is delegated every school year to help & administer a selfcarry EpiPen or any Epinephrine injector.

New medication paperwork is needed every school year and should be filled out by your health care provider and dated after June 1st. The completed paperwork (double check all the required signatures - front & back {selfcarry form is 2 pages}) and medication (double check expiration dates as we cannot accept expired medication) can be turned into Timnath's health office at the beginning of the school year. If you have any questions regarding immunizations or health office needs for TImnath during the 2022-2023 school year, please contact the health office. Kim Williamson, TMHS School Nurse, kwilliamson@psdschools.org. They will be available during August Registration to accept any forms and medication.

Please do not drop it off prior to the August registration as our health office is not set up yet.

Middle School PSD League Format Changes

The Poudre School District Athletic Department is excited to announce changes to Middle School athletic programming beginning in the fall of 2022.

Changes:

- 6th graders will now have opportunities to compete in all individual sports. This includes cross country, golf, track, as well as the additions of tennis and wrestling.
- Football, basketball, and volleyball will be moving to a mixed-grade Varsity/JV/C-team model as opposed to 7th and 8th grade teams (as currently constructed). Softball, and all individual sports referenced above are currently operating under the Varsity/JV/C-team model.

Rationale:

- Increased number of athletic opportunities for 6th grade students.
- Allows athletes to compete and receive instruction at the appropriate level, regardless of grade.
- Provides flexibility for those schools with extremely high/low participation numbers.
- Creates one consistent competitive model across all sports within the PSD Middle School Athletic League.
- Sub-Varsity competition opportunities will be increased.
- Total program roster size will be increased in basketball and volleyball.
