TOY E-BIKE SAFETY SHEET

To keep our community members and riders safe, here's what to know about

TOY VEHICLES & BEYOND!

Mini-bikes are NOT AUTHORIZED for use on public routes. They do not meet the specifications for vehicles that can SAFELY operate on public roads or paths. You can ONLY ride these on your private property.



IF it has a VIN, it is considered a vehicle, must be registered, and is subject to state vehicle laws. You have to have a driver's license and insurance to drive it.

FOCUS ON SAFETY FOR ALL
and stick to the rules of the road.



E-bikes have WORKING PEDALS, and are different than mini-bikes, toy vehicles, low-powered scooters, or motorcycles.

E-bike Classifications

Class 1

- equipped with pedal assist ONLY
- limited to a top speed of 20 mph
- Roads: Yes
- Trails: Yes
- Sidewalks: Yes

Class 2

- equipped with pedal assist AND throttle assist
- limited to a top speed of 20 mph
- Roads: Yes
- Trails: Yes
- Sidewalks: Yes

Class 3

- equipped with speedometer
- assist for speeds up to 28 mph
- Roads: Yes
- Trails: NO
- Sidewalks: NO

Fall Sports

- **Cheerleading:** Had an incredible season that included multiple first-place finishes, a league championship, strong performances at state, and national-level success in Orlando against some of the top teams in the country.
- **Cross Country:** Delivered one of the most successful seasons in school history. The boys team qualified for state for the first time ever, while the girls team repeated as Colorado 4A State Champions and won conference and regional championships for the third consecutive year.
- **Football:** Continued building momentum this season, finishing third in conference, earning the program's first playoff appearance, and defeating the defending state champions during an unforgettable year.
- **Boys Golf:** Continued its incredible success with another Longs Peak League Championship and a State Runner-Up finish with strong individual performances as well. The future of the program remains extremely bright.
- **Timnath Poms:** Made history this season by attending Nationals for the first time in program history, competing in two elite routines, and placing 8th overall at the state competition. This team represented Timnath with incredible pride, dedication, and talent.
- **Boys Soccer:** Established itself as one of the top programs in the state this season, finishing with an outstanding 10-5-2 record and an incredible 14-game undefeated streak.
- **Softball:** Saw tremendous program growth with the highest participation numbers and strongest offensive statistics in school history. The future of the program is incredibly bright.
- **Boys Tennis:** Demonstrated significant growth in experience, toughness, and competitiveness throughout a season defined by both challenges and successes. Finishing with a solid 6-4 record, the team secured key victories over Severance, Prospect Ridge, and Northridge. With no graduating seniors this year, the roster remains intact and ready for an even stronger season next year.
- **Volleyball – Fall:** Finished the season 16-9 overall and 13-3 in league play, earning a second-place finish in the Longs Peak League. With a nearly brand-new varsity lineup, the Cubs overcame early challenges and embraced their identity of “winning the moment.” A major highlight came in Berthoud, where the Cubs snapped the Spartans' 14-match home winning streak in a dominant league win. Timnath closed the season by winning 11 of its final 12 matches and pushed Mullen to five sets in an unforgettable playoff battle.
- **Unified Flag Football:** Had an incredible season, finishing undefeated during the regular season and placing second in postseason competition against some very strong teams. The team continued to grow in understanding the game while maintaining outstanding positivity, teamwork, and energy throughout the season.

Winter Sports

- **Boys Basketball:** Continued its incredible rise this season, finishing with a 23-4 record, advancing to the Final Four, and earning a second-place finish in the Longs Peak League. The Cubs also finished the year ranked second in the final MaxPreps Colorado 4A poll, continuing to establish themselves as one of the premier programs in the state.
- **Girls Basketball:** Put together another outstanding season, finishing with a 21-6 overall record and making a second consecutive trip to the Final Four. This team continued to build a culture centered on growth, togetherness, and commitment to one another, becoming one of the most connected and resilient teams in recent program history.
- **Unified Basketball:** Had an incredible season filled with growth, connection, and success. The Cubs fielded their largest team in program history, captured a district championship, and finished as Regional Runner-Up. More importantly, the season showcased the power of inclusion, teamwork, and joy in competition.
- **Wrestling:** Showed incredible heart this year, battling through a challenging start to the season before finding their rhythm and finishing strong. Throughout the winter, the Cubs focused on building a solid foundation of toughness and perseverance. This steady growth paid off in a big way during the postseason; despite a grueling regional tournament, the team fought hard and sent two athletes to the State Championships.

- Baseball: Took another major step forward this season in the program's first year with seniors. Through all the highs and lows, the team continued to grow, compete, and lay an incredible foundation for the future of Timnath Cubs Baseball. Finishing with a 14-9 record the future of the program is incredibly bright.
- Girls Golf: State Champions! Congratulations to Timnath HS Girls' Golf. Congrats to our High School Girls' Golf team on becoming the 3A State Champions!
- A special shoutout to our top individual finishers:
- Cheyanne Schrick: 1st Place / Gold Medalist (for the second year in a row!)
- Peyton Landon: 2nd Place
- Isla Carlucci: 3rd Place
- Girls Soccer: Finished the regular season with an outstanding 10-1-4 record, highlighted by impressive wins over cross-town rivals Fort Collins and Rocky Mountain. After capturing the Conference Championship, the Cubs secured the number four seed heading into the state playoffs. The Girls' Soccer team made a run to the quarterfinals of the CHSAA 3A State Championship, falling in a penalty shootout. After a grueling three-hour game that remained tied 0-0 through regulation and two double-overtimes, it came down to PKs. While it was a heartbreaker, we are so proud of the team and excited to see what next year holds!
- Girls Tennis: Coming off a season where the program graduated its top three players, few knew what to expect from Girls Tennis — but this team had other plans. The Cubs earned a team state appearance, bonded through every challenge that came their way, and showcased incredible resilience, growth, and leadership throughout the season. Led by an outstanding group of seven seniors, this team made the season unforgettable.
- Track & Field: Delivered another historic season this spring. At the conference championships, the girls captured their third consecutive conference championship, while the boys recorded their best finish in program history by placing second as a team. Both teams defeated multiple top-five 4A programs, twelve conference champions were crowned, and twenty-one athletes earned All-Conference recognition. Our Track and Field team competed hard at the Class 4A State Championships at Jeffco Stadium, the girls' team placing 5th overall!
- Unified Soccer: This year's Unified Soccer Team was our biggest yet, with 6 athletes and 14 peers. They had an exciting and memorable season, finishing with a record of 3 wins, 1 loss, and 2 ties. Their final game against Wellington was especially thrilling. After trailing by four goals, the team fought back to come within one goal before scoring the tying goal in the final 20 seconds of the game!
