



Work Based Learning (WBL), Alternative Cooperative Education (ACE), & College and Career Coordinators at Timnath are available to help students find jobs, internships, apprenticeships, or ongoing volunteer experiences and support students throughout the hiring process. Creating a resume, filling out an application, talking to a boss about a work-school schedule balance, informing students about youth labor laws, and communicating with a manager are some of the things these coordinators can help with. Students should look for current openings on Xello under "Opportunities" first, then email Mrs. Smith to set up an appointment. You can also view these openings on our WBL google classroom. Join the WBL classroom using this code: **gupvc5e**

Students can gain hands-on work experience through the ACE Career Skills class in which they will be working in the school coffee shop and other student-run businesses within the school. Ask Mr. Tolar for more information.

Students can also earn elective high school credits if they are working!. Ask Mrs. Smith for more information.

Counseling Update

The counseling team is excited to kick off ICAP (Individual Career and Academic Planning) work with students on Xello, PSD's software home for college, career, and academic planning and exploration. While we firmly believe that this ICAP work happens through everything students do and experience both in and out of school, Xello is a helpful and robust platform offering a wide variety of tools and resources for students in grades 6-12. As students progress through their time at Timnath their Xello portfolio will change and grow with them, helping them develop and share their interests and passions, skills and strengths, and future goals and dreams.

To orient and guide students through the platform, students will be completing four lessons in each grade level (outlined below) during ELO throughout the remainder of the school year. The lessons for each grade level are as follows:

Grade 6:

1. What is ICAP? Build your Xello Profile: Introduction to individual career and academic planning process and the Xello Platform
2. Explore Learning Styles: Investigate visual, auditory, and tactile learning styles and explore how their learning style can help them in school and a future career.
3. Explore Interests: Complete an interest inventory and investigate how their interests match up with careers or pathways that may suit them well.
4. School Subjects at Work: Investigate how school subjects relate and apply to future careers.

Grade 7:

1. Explore Career Matches: Dig deeper into career match assessment results and explore aspects of a career of interest.
2. Discover Learning Pathways: Complete the Learning Style quiz and investigate post-secondary pathway options
3. Decision Making: Explore the importance and consequences of making informed and well-reasoned decisions and reflect on a recent important decision.
4. Time Management: Explore ways to improve time management skills and assess how they currently manage their time.

Grade 8:

1. Skills: Identify skills needed for a variety of occupations and how school, extracurricular and leisure activities can help build their skillset.
2. Biases and Career Choices: Identify and explore how biases (gender, ethnicity, ability, and class) can influence career choices
3. Transition to High School: Explore ways to make their transition to high school easier and more successful.
4. Spark Interview! Students will engage in a conversational interview with a Timnath staff member about their passions, interests, and connections to our school and will upload a summary and reflection on this process into Xello.

As parents, you can learn more about Xello by visiting the parent guardian section on xello.psdschools.org. You can view your student's work and their developing portfolio by creating a parent account. Middle school parents should be receiving an invitation to create an account linked to their students portfolio when this newsletter is delivered. Please reach out to counselors with any questions - we look forward to supporting your students as they engage in this work!
